

President's message

Dear Friends of UAI,

AS YOU WILL HAVE NOTICED, there was no issue of *Tidings* for January. The editing team felt that instead of producing an issue that would be late and overburden some of the volunteers already overloaded with other works during the Holiday seasons, it was best to focus on the February issue and have it out on time. I hope that your Holiday Seasons was very joyful and I take this late opportunity to give you my best wishes for 2008.

As you might recall, the last thing that was happening at the Representative Council was the vote on the 2008 budget, well good news, it passed without any opposition. It is the first time in the young history of UAI that a budget is approved unanimously. I hope that this is a sign of maturity on the part of the ones making the budget and the ones approving it. 
Africa Seeding Mission Update

Space Time Meets African Time

ONE BRIGHT SUNNY DAY, AFRICA will doubtless be awash with locally printed native language Urantia Books and abuzz with thriving study groups too numerous to ever bother trying to count.

To reach that day from this however is going to take time, effort, money and the stoic, gritty determination of both fieldworkers and the homefront alike. Just like the early pioneer settlers trudging west across North America, the World Seeding Mission, as relatively quick and cheap as it is, doesn't have as its reason for being the breaking of any speed or cost efficiency records. That kind of task would fall more to those who follow in as much that before maps can be read from they must first be written.

Having seeded the last books of the current shipment into Botswana, the long overland haul to Mombasa, Kenya on the east coast where 300 more books were soon due to arrive from India by sea. The previous update having been written in Lusaka, Zambia, a rickety old chicken bus whisked me four hours north to a tiny outpost village called Kapiri Mposhi that enjoyed that singular redeeming quality of being at the beginning of that useable portion of railway track that extends from Lusaka to Dar Es Salaam on the coast of Tanzania.

"Snails move faster" was the exact phrase used by one travel guide in dismissing the oily old locomotive that met my gaze on the track as it quietly burred to itself with cheerfully demented indifference. To their credit however, both proud boasts of the rail authority ultimately proved perfectly true....

Departure time: as per schedule almost to the second.

Arrival time: some time next week.

Oh God I love this job!

The symmetry of it is perfect. A mission of planetary and in a certain sense even super-planetary significance, a model of functional unity and teamwork in loving and unselfish social service, the exotic backdrops

and occasional high thrills of an action movie interspersed with a semi-regular supply of rollicking good laughs!

True to form, exactly 53 hours later the iron snail crawled to a halt at Dar Es Salaam train station and your fieldworker quietly vanished into the Arab quarter of the city he once long ago used to call home. A fifty dollar Kenyan visa the next day then off on a smokey old bus northwards to the town of Tanga for the night. Next morning, another cramped chicken bus across the Tanzania/Kenya border and finally into Mombasa later that day.

(Mombasa. Ah yes. Another colourful memory from way back in my pre-UB seeding days of aimless travel. Only dropping in there for nothing more than a gin, a few days later saw me perched on the bowsprit of a 14,000 ton Russian 'Jadroplov Lines' cargo ship on a two week passage to the mouth of the Suez Canal in Egypt. As we exited the port one evening around dusk, the huge foghorn behind me started bellowing in that intermittent way you'd honk your car horn at an old friend. In reciprocation, all the, er, less than savoury bars shall we say along the headland that sailors tend to frequent to indulge in their respective vices started flashing their bar lights on and off which made me glance back at the ship's bridge with a worldly grin. A quaint nautical custom around these parts I later learned and far too jolly an anecdote to not find a brief mention in these chronicles.)

Linking up with the agent whose details appeared on the shipment's bill of lading, it was explained that although the books had already arrived in port, the consignment had not been sent from the sender in India as a 'door to door' shipment as I had specifically requested but as a normal shipment instead. When simple instructions like this don't get followed in a third world environment, the space-time continuum abruptly ceases, 'Indian time' or 'African time' immediately kicks in and a bureaucratic nightmare usually ensues. Sure

enough, only now am I expecting the final essential original document to arrive from India by courier that should theoretically make the books' final clearance a mere formality though that said, we're now getting uncomfortably close to the Christmas holidays.

All that can be done right now is being done and as and when the books finally clear no time at all will be lost in hand seeding them first to the west as far as blood-spattered little Rwanda then southwards down East Africa to put me back into South Africa so as to collect another shipment of 300 books currently in transit. When those are seeded across what remains of southern Africa that is yet to be covered, that should bring us roughly to the half way stage of the entire African mission and mean around two metric tons of Urantia Books are in place.

A smallish though significant enough portion of a fifth epochal fieldworker's year is usually taken up either in transit or in coaxing books through customs or waiting for someone else to. It comes with the territory at this still early stage of the revelation's evolution. But keep in mind here that all the while such a fieldworker is living out of cheap guest houses and backpacker lodges, feeding himself at cheap eating houses and going straight to bed shortly after it gets dark so no extravagant hotel or travel bills ever get run up.

And as it looks like the holiday season will be weathered here in the bowels of Mombasa, it is from his small room in a little guest house down a relatively quiet backstreet of the inner city that your cheerful co-worker in this big, beautiful and world-uplifting mission of ours sends his warmest and heartiest seasonal greetings to one and all for the holiday season.

My heartfelt thanks as always for your big-hearted support, peace be upon you and God bless you all.

MY VERY FIRST CONTACT WITH *The Urantia Book* was in 1993 when I walked into my local public library in Perth, Western Australia and, as was my custom, went straight to the “Religion” section. There staring me in the face was this enormous hard-covered blue volume with an intriguing name but no author. I quickly thumbed through it and, drawn by the fascinating chapter headings, immediately decided to borrow it. I ended up borrowing it three times in a row.

At this point I need to explain why I always looked for books on religion when I went to the library. My search for spiritual truth started when I was only a young boy of 10. My mother, who was raised a Catholic, was also a spiritual seeker and had looked into a variety of religions including Christian Spiritualism and Tibetan Buddhism. I used to read anything that she brought home and would often accompany her to meetings and would attend groups held at our house.

In my teen years, we were door-knocked by a very kind man from the Jehovah’s Witnesses organization and at the age of 16, I began studying the Bible with him. I raised every conceivable objection to what he was teaching but over a period of two years I became convinced that these people had The Truth. Within a short time, I became a ‘pioneer’ which meant that I door-knocked for at least 100 hours per month.

At the age of 21, I met my first wife who had been born and bred as a Jehovah’s Witness. We had three delightful children

which eventually meant that I had to do less doorknocking and more paid work. I remained a devoted member of this organization for the next 8 years. It was then, however, that I began to find inconsistencies and incongruences in their dogma, which led me to approach the elders of my local church as well as write a comprehensive letter outlining my ‘discoveries’ to the Governing Body of the organization in New York. I was warned not to discuss my doubts with anyone, including my wife, which put an enormous strain on our marriage. My doubts quickly turned into strong convictions and the situation became very serious.

I was given an ultimatum by the elders that I could not breathe a word of my beliefs to anyone otherwise I would be excommunicated from the organization. In my conscience, I could not agree to this and so in September 1983, I was formerly disfellowshipped from “The Truth”. My wife continued as a Jehovah’s Witness and under these difficult circumstances, it was impossible to maintain the viability of our relationship. We divorced several years later and I began to explore what other Christian churches had to say; my God was becoming bigger! However, I was soon to be disillusioned by the attitudes to truth that I discovered.... everyone had their own ‘ism’ and looked askance at anyone who was different.

In 1990, I went through a rough patch, a kind of ‘nervous breakdown’ during which I became very angry with God and fed up with the narrow-mindedness of organized religion.

I put God and religion on the ‘backburner’ and decided to start having some fun. It was then that I met my second wife. I also decided to go back to university and study psychology and history. Despite all that had happened to me, however, I couldn’t get God out of my system. It was just before I started uni that I discovered *The Urantia Book* in my local library. I went to university full-time for 6 years which left little time for religious pursuits. Nevertheless, I came in contact with spiritual people who were not Christian and this made me realize that God was much bigger than I ever imagined.

I had almost forgotten about *The Urantia Book* when in November 2003, I ‘stumbled’ across a brand new copy in a book shop a few years after graduating. I bought the book and started reading voraciously even, vociferously. I then moved with my wife and our two children to Tasmania where I began my own private clinical psychology practice. I started a Urantia Book readers group with another couple living close by and made contact with ANZURA. I have just attended my second Urantia Conference and have met some truly inspiring people. I can say with total conviction that *The Urantia Book* has in a truly breathtaking way, broadened and enlarged my concept of God. I feel so blessed that God has rewarded my ongoing quest for truth.

THE LOCAL URANTIA ASSOCIATION OF Barranquilla is one of the new associations belonging to the Urantia movement. However, it's one of the most organized regarding the way of reading *The Urantia Book*. What follows is a summary about how we met, how we started a study group, how we get associated and how we're still here along the years, despite differences, using a bond difficult to break and forget – friendship.

In 2000, two groups of readers of *The Urantia Book* had the opportunity of meeting each other. Since then we were reading *The Urantia Book* separately. The first group was headed by Franklin Marrugo (who was president of our Local Association) and was composed of people older than 30. They organized and gave publicity to a lecture about *The Urantia Book* conducted by Carlos Zapata (then president of the National Association of Colombia). That lecture was attended by many interested people –among them, the group of readers which I belong, composed of 7 people younger than 20, and where Fabian Herrera stood out as its leader.

As a result of that lecture, both groups got together, creating the first study group in our town, recognized by our National Association. At the beginning, we met each Monday for two hours (from 7 to 9 pm), hosted by Semedeth, one of its members, who left the group before our Local Association was created.

We started our reading from the Foreword, making a sequential and consecutive group reading. However, each member did their personal reading on their own way. All of us contributed much to the analysis of Papers because it was a very interdisciplinary group. Young members studied a wide variety of degrees at the university – Medicine, Biology, Engineering, Psychology, Mathematics and Physics- and the adults, being professionals - Laws, Theology and their life experience. In the course of time the group was growing in number, most of its members being young people.

Concerning meetings, each month we volunteered as facilitators for next meeting, so everybody felt a responsible for the meetings. In the meetings *The Urantia Book* study was merged with other topics. For us as a group, it was important that each member was able to express, not only their understandings about TUB, but also what they enjoyed and knew about life .. was this life long or short?

In 2002, thanks to Patricia Ramirez (then president of the National Association of Colombia), we met Oscar Morales, who had read *The Urantia Book* for many years and was eager to share with other readers in town. In so little time Cathy Jones got to Barranquilla and licensed our Local Association. Thanks go to the efforts of Oscar, Patricia and Carlos Zapata, and being the first president. Franklin Marrugo. But the visit of Cathy is another story; this angel –as everyone says- came to Barranquilla for a weekend and she is still with us in our hearts.

In 2003 Fabian Herrera Acevedo was elected as President. We had the same meeting methods and we were studying Part III of TUB. In 2004 I was elected as President of our Local Association, and this coincided with the visit of Gaetan Charland to Colombia. His visit to Barranquilla, as it was with Cathy's visit, is another story. We consider him as the father of our Association, always attentive and concerned about our lives, not only as members of the Association, but also as human beings.


Some months after, we met Jairo Franco (then president of

the National Association), who proposed the idea of organizing the National Conference in the "Eje Cafetero" area. We were very pleased with that idea and started working as a team to collect funds and did many activities to that purpose. At the end of 2005 we were so absorbed by our life activities that we gave up our meetings.

In 2006, and little by little, we started again our meetings but this time with a different methodology. We chose one Paper and, as long as we read a paragraph, we gave our opinion on the subject. This way we gave many remarks about our life experiences. We did not follow any order in our readings and spoke about subjects as long as new questions arose. We discussed topics such as civilizations, the ages of Light and Life, the learning process of man in his mortal stage and the Part IV of *The Urantia Book*. From time to time, we discussed a free topic to escape from routine.

New members were added to our group, some leaving. However Nubia Aldana, a lonely reader, was so integrated with the group that she is now the president of our Local Association. She is very interested in sharing the revelation of *The Urantia Book* with other people, and was willing not only to attend meetings but hosting two study groups at home. In the first group they discussed about the life of Jesus and, in the second group, a consecutive reading of the book is made. Nowadays we are reading Part II of the book.

"Ancient" readers—as we, the members of our Association, called them tenderly, because the vast majority of readers in the group have not read *The Urantia Book* in its entirety and by the moment they are only study group members—get together each Monday of each month, varying the meeting place and time. We are reading separate subjects of *The Urantia Book* and at the moment we are focused on the subject of ego. In addition, we are very enthusiastic about the dissemination of *The Urantia Book*, and buy copies at a reasonable price to offer to interested people.

As time passes by, we hope to be together and look for more people to get interested in *The Urantia Book*, not only to take part in groups of readers but also in our Association. All this with the blessings of our Heavenly Father, the merciful intervention of Michael of Nebadon and the eternal wisdom of the Divine Minister. □
